BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR FEBRUARY 2015

On 4 January 2015, the Annual Diocesan Eucharistic Procession was held from Milagres Church to Rosario Cathedral. Nearly 10,000 people participated in it. I thank all the parish priests, religious priests, deacons and brothers and sisters, hundreds of volunteers and all our lay leaders for making the procession a devout one. This has been a manifestation of our faith in the Eucharistic Lord. Let us continue our piety towards our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

On 14, 15, 16 January, at Mudipu, we celebrated sainthood and the feast of St Joseph Vaz with lot of devotion and fervour. Every day thousands of pilgrims visited the Shrine and honoured St Joseph Vaz, who was at one time the missionary of Ullal Panir and neighbouring parishes. We are indeed fortunate to have a Saint in heaven who has walked the land of Canara and exercised his ministry from our Cathedral, the Church of Our Lady of Most Holy Rosary, Mangalore. We have confidence that he prays for us. He has already become a popular saint among the faithful of our Diocese. The holy places and shrines of saints should inspire us to lead a life worthy of our calling and deepen our faith in Christ and thereby become the messenger of the gospel to people around us. I congratulate the parish priest and all his collaborators for having worked hard untiringly for the success of the celebraions of St Joseph Vas at Mudipu.

On 11 February, the feast of our Lady of Lourdes will be celebrated. Let the day be kept up as a day for good health. Suitable devotion may be held in parishes before the Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes and special services to the sick people may be held.

The Holy Childhood association is in our Diocese in some parishes. I request you to give attention to it and to start the association in parishes for smaller children. The Holy Childhood day is celebrated on 8 February and the collection made during the Mass is sent to the National Office and the amount is spent for the welfare of poor children.

On 18 February the Holy season of lent will begin with Ash Wednesday. I request you to kindly to go through the instructions given in the Ordo regarding lent. The lenten season is kept up with prayer and penance by the faithful. The law of abstinence starts from the age of 14 years, whereas the law of fasting starts from the completion of 18 years and ends at the completion of 59 years. The meat is avoided on all Fridays of the year and specially in lenten season. However a substitute penance could be chosen in case of inconvenience. The usual spiritual practices be held in parishes. I wish that all the pastors are available in the parishes to the faithful all through the lent. Please don't go on leave from the parishes. The special services to be provided to the aged and sick persons in their homes.

I wish you a fruitful lenten season and a good spiritual preparation for Easter.

MESSAGE OF THE HOLY FATHER ON THE OCCASION OF THE TWENTY-THIRD WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

(11 FEBRUARY 2015)

Sapientia Cordis "I was eyes to the blind, and feet to the lame" (Job 29:15)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On this, the twenty-third World Day of the Sick, begun by Saint John Paul II, I turn to all of you who are burdened by illness and are united in various ways to the flesh of the suffering Christ, as well as to you, professionals and volunteers in the field of health care.

This year's theme invites us to reflect on a phrase from the Book of Job: "I was eyes to the blind, and feet to the lame" (*Job* 29:15). I would like to consider this phrase from the perspective of "*sapientia cordis*" – the wisdom of the heart.

- This "wisdom" is no theoretical, abstract knowledge, the product of reasoning. Rather, it is, as Saint James describes it in his Letter, "pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, without uncertainty or insincerity" (3:17). It is a *way of seeing things infused by the Holy Spirit* in the minds and the hearts of those who are sensitive to the sufferings of their brothers and sisters and who can see in them the image of God. So let us take up the prayer of the Psalmist: "Teach us to number our days that we may gain a *heart of wisdom*" (*Ps* 90:12). This "*sapientia cordis*", which is a gift of God, is a compendium of the fruits of the World Day of the Sick.
- 2. Wisdom of the heart means serving our brothers and sisters. Job's words: "I was eyes to the blind, and feet to the lame", point to the service which this just man, who enjoyed a certain authority and a position of importance amongst the elders of his city, offered to those in need. His moral grandeur found expression in the help he gave to the poor who sought his help and in his care for orphans and widows (*Job* 29:12-13).

Today too, how many Christians show, not by their words but by lives rooted in a genuine faith, that they are "eyes to the blind" and "feet to the lame"! They are close to the sick in need of constant care and help in washing, dressing and eating. This service, especially when it is protracted, can become tiring and burdensome. It is relatively easy to help someone for a few days but it is difficult to look after a person for months or even years, in some cases when he or she is no longer capable of expressing gratitude. And yet, what a great path of sanctification this is! In those difficult moments we can rely in a special way on the closeness of the Lord, and we become a special means of support for the Church's mission.

3. Wisdom of the heart means being with our brothers and sisters. Time spent with the sick is holy time. It is a way of praising God who conforms us to the image of his Son, who "came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (*Mt* 20:28). Jesus himself said: "I am among you as one who serves" (*Lk* 22:27).

With lively faith let us ask the Holy Spirit to grant us the grace to appreciate the value of our often unspoken willingness to spend time with these sisters and brothers who, thanks to our closeness and affection, feel more loved and comforted. How great a lie, on the other hand, lurks behind certain phrases which so insist on the importance of "quality of life" that they make people think that lives affected by grave illness are not worth living!

4. Wisdom of the heart means going forth from ourselves towards our brothers and sisters. Occasionally our world forgets the special value of time spent at the bedside of the sick, since we are in such a rush; caught up as we are in a frenzy of doing, of producing, we forget about giving ourselves freely, taking care of others, being responsible for others. Behind this attitude there is often a lukewarm faith which has forgotten the Lord's words: "You did it unto me' (*Mt* 25:40). For this reason, I would like once again to stress "the absolute

priority of 'going forth from ourselves toward our brothers and sisters' as one of the two great commandments which ground every moral norm and as the clearest sign for discerning spiritual growth in response to God's completely free gift" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 179). The missionary nature of the Church is the wellspring of an "effective charity and a compassion which understands, assists and promotes" (ibid).

5. Wisdom of the heart means showing solidarity with our brothers and sisters while not judging them. Charity takes time. Time to care for the sick and time to visit them. Time to be at their side like Job's friends: "And they sat with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great" (*Job* 2:13). Yet Job's friends harboured a judgement against him: they thought that Job's misfortune was a punishment from God for his sins. True charity is a sharing which does not judge, which does not demand the conversion of others; it is free of that false humility which, deep down, seeks praise and is self-satisfied about whatever good it does.

Job's experience of suffering finds its genuine response only in the cross of Jesus, the supreme act of God's solidarity with us, completely free and abounding in mercy. This response of love to the drama of human pain, especially innocent suffering, remains for ever impressed on the body of the risen Christ; his glorious wounds are a scandal for faith but also the proof of faith (cf. *Homily for the Canonization of John XXIII and John Paul II*, 27 April 2014).

Even when illness, loneliness and inability make it hard for us to reach out to others, the experience of suffering can become a privileged means of transmitting grace and a source for gaining and growing in *sapientia cordis*. We come to understand how Job, at the end of his experience, could say to God: "I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you" (42:5). People immersed in the mystery of suffering and pain, when they accept these in faith, can themselves become living witnesses of a faith capable of embracing suffering, even without being able to understand its full meaning.

6. I entrust this World Day of the Sick to the maternal protection of Mary, who conceived and gave birth to Wisdom incarnate: Jesus Christ, our Lord.

O Mary, Seat of Wisdom, intercede as our Mother for all the sick and for those who care for them! Grant that, through our service of our suffering neighbours, and through the experience of suffering itself, we may receive and cultivate true wisdom of heart!

BIBLE TEXT, REFLECTIONS AND PRAYERS FOR HEALING MINISTRY WEEK, 2015

DAY 1: SICKNESS - AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE GOD

Suggested Reading: 2 kings 20:1-11

"This is what the Lord, the God of your father David, says: I have heard your prayer and seen your tears; I will heal you. On the third day from now you will go up to the temple of the Lord. I will add fifteen years to your life".

Reflection

Value of life becomes more prominent when a person faces death (terminally ill). When do we realize the value of life 'as never before'? It is, when a close relative faces death or a loved one faces the inevitable and when an individual faces death knowing that the end is near.

King Hezekiah when he was sick and realized through prophet, 'you will not recover from your sickness but will die' reacted as any normal individual would feel, turning his face to the wall in depression not wanting to face the world. But the beauty of a child of God facing death is that he is in a way facing God on the other side and asking Him to change the destiny pronounced on him. King Hezekiah wept bitterly and bargained with God for a prolonged life. The Lord hears his prayer, and a new chapter of life was added to Hezekiah's life, rather a second opportunity to do more service to the people of God. Through this he realized the value of life and experiences a new meaning and purpose of life that was given to him. He understood who the source of life was. Turning to the source of life surely transformed the way he envisaged life. The new lease of life was offered so that he would bring the nation back in order.

Sickness is an opportunity to know what it means to have health and value it. Through suffering we experience God, value our life and respect our neighbors. Life becomes more precious in the context of sickness and suffering and increases our dependence on God.

For personal reflection and discussion

Reflect on one of your own or your close relatives' experiences with sickness and suffering

Prayer

Father, source of our life, help us to help us to experience you in the midst of sickness and suffering. Amen.

Action

Assist someone to transform one of their sufferings into a God experience

DAY 2: SICKNESS – AN OPPORTUNITY TO DISCERN GOD'S PLAN

Suggested Reading: Genesis 21:8-21

"What troubles you, Hagar? Do not be afraid; for God has heard the voice of the boy where he is."

Reflection

Hagar did not go well with Sarah and Abraham whom. Therefore Abraham decided to send Hagar and Ishmael away from home as this was disrupting the peace at home. Hagar and Ishmael wandered in the wilderness to the point of the death when God intervened and saved both of them and finally God made a nation out of Ishmael through their struggle.

God accepts all who are disowned and pushed to the edge by fellow human beings, gives them space, and hears their cries. It does not matter to Him whatever may be the nation, tribes, region, caste, region the person may represent. God accepts them as they are and promises to make a new plan and purpose to them provided they all call unto the Lord in their distress. In other words, God can generate good out of evil.

There is injustice in our society in all forms. Abraham's family is also not free from this reality and goes through a similar situation. Such conflict crosses the family boundary and affects relationships between ethnic groups and nations, even today. How do we discern God's plan in such struggles? In spite of these struggles in human life, God's plan will finally come into effect in order to work out His plans for human good. (Rom. 8:28)

For personal reflection and discussion

Reflect on one of your experiences where God made good out of a bad situation

Prayer

Father, source of our life, forgive us for deviating from your plan. Help us to discern your will in the midst of suffering. Amen.

Action

Assist someone to discover God's will and plan in the midst of their suffering.

DAY 3: SICKNESS – AN OPPORTUNITY TO UNDERSTAND SUFFERING IN-DEPTH

Suggested Reading: Job 42:4- 5

"Listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you shall answer me... My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you".

Reflection

An important question that the theme raises is whether people have freedom to choose life. What do the terms "freedom", "choosing" and "life" mean? Some of these are addressed in one of the most profound Biblical books, the book of Job. The book mainly deals with the meaning of suffering that too when a righteous person like Job suffers and so many difficult questions are raised.

As per the counsel of Job's friends - God is always right and human must learn from God - Disasters are for moral discipline and forms of punishment. Alternatively Job engages with God and questions God's justice, describes the world as chaotic and depicts suffering in terms of victimization. God's speech challenges the paradigms of Job and his friends. God affirms that sickness, disease, suffering, pain and all forms of injustice is very much part of human life. Chaos is an indispensable aspect of the created order. Job is confronted by God to face the terrible situation that he refused and feared to see. The divine speeches challenge Job's understanding of where the presence of God may be found – not only in the comforts of life but also in desolation and with the outcasts of the society. Though he wrestled with God, Job also remained open to God's vision.

Job's tragedy is a reality in many lives in India and elsewhere. Issues posed by Job's book, significance of choosing how to live in the midst of suffering involves understanding the character of God, the nature of creation, the place of suffering in the world and, the significance of moral and pious life. It is so significant for ministry in a multi-faith context in which people/ community's perspectives on God, life, sickness, suffering, healing differ.

For personal reflection and discussion

What are the different forms of suffering you know? Is there a relationship between sin and sickness/suffering? If yes, what?

Prayer

Father, source of our life, help us to reach a deeper understanding of life in the midst of sickness and suffering. Amen.

Action

Assist someone to transform one of their sufferings into a deeper understanding of life.

DAY 4: SICKNESS – AN OPPORTUNITY TO CELEBRATE HEALING

01-02-2015

Suggested Reading: Acts 3: 1-10

"Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God".

Reflection

Though lame man was at the Temple premises, he never had the opportunity to join the worship with others inside the Temple as he was considered only fit for begging. He asked for money as Peter and John entered the Temple. The interesting aspect here was that the beggar never asked for healing. He simply wanted a coin or some change for his expenses. Nevertheless, as soon as Peter touched his hand and lifted him up, jumping he stood up and entered the Temple for the first time in his life praising God.

The transformation from dependence on others to independence, as this man entered a new phase of life and liberation. This is an indication that as stewards of God we are called to make people find long lasting self-sufficiency and not temporary relief. His helpers no more had to bring him for begging because he was healed and liberated by the power of Jesus through reaching out for help with Peter and John. How can we make individuals, institutions and organizations belonging to the healing ministry celebrate life by transforming lives of people. Since we are called and expected to touch the lives of the needy and help them chose life in partnership with God for great transformation and celebration. The impediments of crippled state turned into leaping state could be considered as a sign of new life.

For personal reflection and discussion

How can we celebrate the healing presence of God in our midst?

Prayer:

Father, source of our life, help us to see your hand in all the healing that is happening around us and celebrate your healing presence in our midst. Amen.

Action

Assist five people to transform the experience of healing into a celebration.

DAY 5: SICKNESS – AN OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD GOD'S KINGDOM

Suggested Reading: Nehemiah 2:11-20

"Come and let us build the wall of Jerusalem, that we may no longer be a reproach... So they said, Let us rise up and build".

Reflection

The story of Nehemiah continues to fascinate! Here was a Jewish captive in Babylon, who had earned the trust and favor of a heathen king, and rose to have a very important and responsible job of being the king's cupbearer. Though he was comfortably placed he chose to become uncomfortable when he was told of the miserable condition of the wall of Jerusalem and the distress of his fellow men living there. He wept, fasted and prayed to God confessing the sins of the people.

Nehemiah saw the need and heard the Call. He realized that the people were without any hope and had resolved themselves to a life of gloom and despair. He challenged his people that if they would all unite together there was hope to make the impossible possible. He fought those who opposed this work and motivated people from all walks of life - goldsmiths, perfume-makers, rulers, singers, merchants, temple servants, women, priests and Levites to accomplish the job. Not only did Nehemiah repair the wall, he also united the people and stopped

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the oppression of the poor. He brought about religious reforms by making the people confess their sins. Indeed he brought life to a nation that was dead.

We live in a broken world that is divided and among a people who have got used to negativity, corruption, crime and intolerance as a way of life. There seems to be no hope of a collateral change in the coming days. Yet God has chosen us to be His ambassadors to be the salt in a decaying society and bring light in the dark world. We are His agents to build the Kingdom of God in this world. Are we willing to respond to this Call? The choice is ours.

DAY 6: SICKNESS – AN OPPORTUNITY TO JOURNEY WITH CHRIST

Suggested Reading: Matthew 7:13-20

"Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it."

Reflection

Everyone is on a spiritual journey in life, whether we acknowledge it or not. The choices we make that affect the direction in which we have to travel to reach our destination. Jesus spoke of two ways: one way to destruction and the other way to life. The way to destruction is broad and it becomes an automatic choice of many. The way to life is narrow and does not become an automatic choice of many as the way to life is difficult, and there are only a few who finds it.

Jesus warns about the power that works against his will and purpose to distract people to make wrong decisions and take them via easy way that is broad and will lead to destruction. We need to be able to identify them, and able to neutralize the evil. The pastors, priests, prophets, evangelists, missionaries whom God has called and given responsibility to guide His people through the narrow way by His word and inspiring people through the Holy Spirit. Thus help people of God to reach the ultimate destination: eternal life.

We need to pray to protect us on the journey of life to follow only Christ; be rooted in Christ. It is important we know Christ and trust Him at all times and keep our faith and relationship through prayer so that we are not distracted in our life journey.
