BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR OCTOBER 2019

The month of October has two related devotions in the Church: (a) the **Holy Rosary** and (b) the **Missions of the Church**. Most fittingly, the month begins with the Feast of St. Therese of the Child Jesus on October 1st. She is the Patroness of the Missions alongside St. Francis Xavier, SJ. Together these two great saints show us the two fold dimension of all missionary spirituality: 1) contemplative prayer and sacrifice 2) active missionary apostolate.

All the baptized are called to participate in the love for our neighbour and the mission of Christ's redemption suffering for the salvation of the world. We cannot neglect to pray and sacrifice for the conversion of souls and for the missionaries in the field. Similarly, we cannot casually set aside the task of making Christ known to others through the witness of our lives, and the preaching of the Gospel according to our state of life.

The Church honours Our Lady of Rosary on October 7 and consecrates the month especially as the month of the Rosary. We are also invited to recall Our Lady of Fatima's final message and great miracle of the sun on October 13, 1917. Her maternal teaching to the faithful has always been to pray for peace by praying the Rosary. Let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.

The Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. This can be summarized by the traditional phrase used by Pope Pius XII that the Rosary is “a compendium of the entire Gospel”. The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption. St John Paul II so often reminded us: “the Rosary is a Christocentric prayer.”

The Missionary Rosary invites us to pray for various parts of the world as we pass through the five mysteries of any given day. Learn more about the Missionary Rosary directly, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart (Lk. 2:19). Here is the proposed structure of praying the Missionary Rosary: Announce the mystery; Read the missionary prayer intention; Read the Gospel or another part of the Sacred Scriptures; Read a Mission testimony OR read a patristic spiritual text OR read a reflection on the Mystery being prayed or on the missionary intention; Pray the Our Father; Ten Hail Marys; Glory Be; and Pray for the Dead (Fatima Prayer).

I thank all of you for your good wishes on the occasion of the First Anniversary of my Episcopal Ordination and Installation as Bishop of Mangalore. I am grateful to you for accompanying me with your prayers for **my first *ad limina* visit**. I met the Holy Father and I have offered him greetings and prayers on behalf the diocese. He has blessed all of you. The *ad limina* visit was good. Praying at the tomb of the Holy Apostles and meeting with Pope Francis were spiritual key moments of the visit. The important “pastoral dimension” of the visit was being able to be with the Pope together with other brother bishops of the southern region, which is a manifestation of the Bishops’ link to the Bishop of Rome by the bond of episcopal communion (*cum Petro*) while, at the same time of the hierarchical subjection to him as head of the college (*sub Petro*). I have had also the opportunity to meet the heads of dicasteries and discuss with them matters pertinent to our diocese.

During Dasara Holidays in October, we have an illustrious tradition of organizing **Jeevan Jyothi Camps** in almost all the deaneries of the diocese or at the inter-parish level. These camps assist the high-school students to use their time to deepen their knowledge about religion, faith, social issues, personality development,

and focus on their future education, career and vocation. I appreciate the efforts of priests and their collaborators, the involvement of youth and lay persons in conducting the camp with great zeal. The camp should create a great impact on the young high-school students at a deeper level of personal motivation. It should not just end up as a fun or play time.

October 1 is celebrated as the **International Day of Older Persons**. The day is acknowledged to raise awareness about the factors and issues affecting older people, such as deterioration with age and to examine issues that affect their lives such as abuse of elderly people. It is also a day to recognize and appreciate the contributions that older people make to society. The theme of this year is: "The Journey to Age Equality".

"Elderly people help us to see human affairs with greater wisdom, because life's vicissitudes have brought them knowledge and maturity. They are the guardians of our collective memory, and thus the privileged interpreters of that body of ideals and common values which support and guide life in society. To exclude the elderly is in a sense to deny the past, in which the present is firmly rooted, in the name of a modernity without memory. Precisely because of their mature experience, the elderly are able to offer young people precious advice and guidance" (Letter of Pope John Paul II to the Elderly, October 1, 1999).

We remember and appreciate our senior priests who are no longer able to remain in active ministry; they have persevered in their vocation for many years. It is not really accurate, therefore, to say priests are "retired", as they have only retired from full-time ministry, not their vocation. They remain priests forever. They demonstrate faith and trust in Jesus during difficult circumstances in their old age such as serious health problems. But they continue to serve the Church by a life of prayer, by offering up their suffering, and by ministering to people in other ways, such as being available to listen and provide spiritual counsel.

Before the next issue of *Internos* reaches you, we will be celebrating the **Solemnity of All Saints** on November 1 and **All Souls Day** on November 2. These paired feasts encourage us to hope for heaven while remembering those who have passed away

and are in need of our prayers. Catholics can gain special indulgences for the faithful departed during the first eight days of November. Among the many customs, the tolling of church bells from noon of All Saints Day reminds the faithful to pray for the souls in purgatory.

The latest edition of the *Enchiridion of Indulgences* states: 1. A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who (a) on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed; (b) on All Souls' Day (or, according to the judgment of the ordinary, on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on the solemnity of All Saints), devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed. The conditions for gaining the indulgence are: (a) do the work while in the state of grace; (b) make a sacramental confession within 20 days; (c) receive Communion (d) pray for the Pope's intentions; (e) have no attachment to sin, even venial sin (this can involve resolving to love God and reject sin).

“On the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), all Priests may celebrate or concelebrate three Masses, provided that the celebrations take place at different times, and with due regard for what has been laid down regarding the application of second and third Masses” (GIRM 204d). Concerning the norms on the application, it must be kept in mind that “while Priests may at their preference apply one of the Masses in favour of any person/intention and accept for that Mass a stipend, they may not accept a stipend for the second or for the third Mass, the second of which they are bound to apply respectively for all the faithful departed and the third for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.”

May the Extraordinary Missionary Month and the Mission Sunday we celebrate during this month be for us an intense and fruitful occasion of grace, and an occasion to promote initiatives, advance the preaching of the Gospel, biblical and theological reflection on the Church's mission, works of Christian charity, and practical works of cooperation and solidarity between Churches, and above all prayer, the soul of all missionary activity.

REVISED CONSTITUTION ON PARISH COUNCILS

The present Parish Councils – Pastoral and Finance - end their term of three years on December 31, 2019. I direct the Parish Priests to organize the election proceedings as per the Revised *Pastoral Constitutions of Mangalore Diocese* promulgated on September 15, 2019. These Constitutions come into effect on October 1, 2019. Printed copies of the Constitutions are available at the Reception Counter of Bishop's House, Kodialbail and Mangala Jyothi, Bajjodi. The cost is Rs 50/- per copy.

I instruct the Parish Priests/Parochial Administrators to begin working from the month of October on the process of election, nomination and so on, with right earnest so that the establishment of new Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Council and other Committees is done as per norms and well in time.

Parish Priests and all those involved in the process of establishing the new Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Council as well as other Committees referred to in the Constitutions are hereby directed to follow the procedures laid down in the Constitutions accurately and thereby avoid any misunderstanding and haziness. All are called upon to familiarize themselves with the revised Constitutions, and instruct the faithful so that they too know, understand and follow the norms of the Constitution.

The time-schedule for the establishment of the new Councils is as follows:

1. From October 1, 2019: Parish Pastoral Councils, Its Office Bearers, Parish Finance Council, and other Committees
2. Within March 31, 2020: Deanery Pastoral Councils
3. Within May 31, 2020: Diocesan Pastoral Council

The election to Parish Pastoral Council, its Office bearers, and Finance Council should be over well in time and ***approval from the Bishop should be obtained by December 31, 2019***. The new Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils come into effect from January 1, 2020.

When the list of Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Council members is sent to the Bishop for approval, it should contain the following information: (a) Name of the member; (b) Information on whether the member belongs to the ex-officio, elected or nominated category; (c) date of birth; (d) educational qualification; (e) in the case of Vice-President and Secretary, their mobile phone numbers and contact address; (f) and finally, a declaration from the Parish Priest stating that the norms relating to election, nomination and formation of the new Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Council have been followed, and its office bearers and members possess the eligibility criteria for membership/offices in the Councils.

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS FRANCIS FOR WORLD MISSION DAY 2019

Baptized and Sent:

The Church of Christ on Mission in the World

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

For the month of October 2019, I have asked that the whole Church revive her missionary awareness and commitment as we commemorate the centenary of the Apostolic Letter *Maximum Illud* of Pope Benedict XV (30 November 1919). Its farsighted and prophetic vision of the apostolate has made me realize once again the importance of renewing the Church's missionary commitment and giving fresh evangelical impulse to her work of preaching and bringing to the world the salvation of Jesus Christ, who died and rose again.

The title of the present Message is the same as that of October's Missionary Month: *Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World*. Celebrating this month will help

us first to rediscover the missionary dimension of our faith in Jesus Christ, a faith graciously bestowed on us in baptism. Our filial relationship with God is not something simply private, but always in relation to the Church. Through our communion with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we, together with so many of our other brothers and sisters, are born to new life. This divine life is not a product for sale – we do not practise proselytism – but a treasure to be given, communicated and proclaimed: that is the meaning of mission. We received this gift freely and we share it freely (cf. *Mt* 10:8), without excluding anyone. God wills that all people be saved by coming to know the truth and experiencing his mercy through the ministry of the Church, the universal sacrament of salvation (cf. *1 Tim* 2:4; *LG*, 48).

The Church is on mission in the world. Faith in Jesus Christ enables us to see all things in their proper perspective, as we view the world with God's own eyes and heart. Hope opens us up to the eternal horizons of the divine life that we share. Charity, of which we have a foretaste in the sacraments and in fraternal love, impels us to go forth to the ends of the earth (cf. *Mic* 5:4; *Mt* 28:19; *Acts* 1:8; *Rom* 10:18). A Church that presses forward to the farthest frontiers requires a constant and ongoing missionary conversion. How many saints, how many men and women of faith, witness to the fact that this unlimited openness, this going forth in mercy, is indeed possible and realistic, for it is driven by love and its deepest meaning as gift, sacrifice and gratuitousness (cf. *2 Cor* 5:14-21)! The man who preaches God must be a man of God (cf. *Maximum Illud*).

This missionary mandate touches us personally: I am a mission, always; you are a mission, always; every baptized man and woman is a mission. People in love never stand still: they are drawn out of themselves; they are attracted and attract others in turn; they give themselves to others and build relationships that are life-giving. As far as God's love is concerned, no one is useless or insignificant. Each of us is a mission to the world, for each of us is the fruit of God's love. Even if parents can betray their love by lies, hatred and infidelity, God never takes back his gift of life. From eternity he has destined each of his children to share in his divine and eternal life (cf. *Eph* 1:3-6).

This life is bestowed on us in baptism, which grants us the gift of faith in Jesus Christ, the conqueror of sin and death. Baptism gives us rebirth in God's own image and likeness, and makes us members of the Body of Christ, which is the Church. In this sense, baptism is truly necessary for salvation for it ensures that we are always and everywhere sons and daughters in the house of the Father, and never orphans, strangers or slaves. What in the Christian is a sacramental reality – whose fulfillment is found in the Eucharist – remains the vocation and destiny of every man and woman in search of conversion and salvation. For baptism fulfils the promise of the gift of God that makes everyone a son or daughter in the Son. We are children of our natural parents, but in baptism we receive the origin of all fatherhood and true motherhood: no one can have God for a Father who does not have the Church for a mother (cf. Saint Cyprian, *De Cath. Eccl.*, 6).

Our mission, then, is rooted in the fatherhood of God and the motherhood of the Church. The mandate given by the Risen Jesus at Easter is inherent in Baptism: as the Father has sent me, so I send you, filled with the Holy Spirit, for the reconciliation of the world (cf. *Jn* 20:19-23; *Mt* 28:16-20). This mission is part of our identity as Christians; it makes us responsible for enabling all men and women to realize their vocation to be adoptive children of the Father, to recognize their personal dignity and to appreciate the intrinsic worth of every human life, from conception until natural death. Today's rampant secularism, when it becomes an aggressive cultural rejection of God's active fatherhood in our history, is an obstacle to authentic human fraternity, which finds expression in reciprocal respect for the life of each person. Without the God of Jesus Christ, every difference is reduced to a baneful threat, making impossible any real fraternal acceptance and fruitful unity within the human race.

The universality of the salvation offered by God in Jesus Christ led Benedict XV to call for an end to all forms of nationalism and ethnocentrism, or the merging of the preaching of the Gospel with the economic and military interests of the colonial powers.

In his Apostolic Letter *Maximum Illud*, the Pope noted that the Church's universal mission requires setting aside exclusivist ideas of membership in one's own country and ethnic group. The opening of the culture and the community to the salvific newness of Jesus Christ requires leaving behind every kind of undue ethnic and ecclesial introversion. Today too, the Church needs men and women who, by virtue of their baptism, respond generously to the call to leave behind home, family, country, language and local Church, and to be sent forth to the nations, to a world not yet transformed by the sacraments of Jesus Christ and his holy Church. By proclaiming God's word, bearing witness to the Gospel and celebrating the life of the Spirit, they summon to conversion, baptize and offer Christian salvation, with respect for the freedom of each person and in dialogue with the cultures and religions of the peoples to whom they are sent. The *missio ad gentes*, which is always necessary for the Church, thus contributes in a fundamental way to the process of ongoing conversion in all Christians. Faith in the Easter event of Jesus; the ecclesial mission received in baptism; the geographic and cultural detachment from oneself and one's own home; the need for salvation from sin and liberation from personal and social evil: all these demand the mission that reaches to the very ends of the earth.

The providential coincidence of this centenary year with the celebration of the Special Synod on the Churches in the Amazon allows me to emphasize how the mission entrusted to us by Jesus with the gift of his Spirit is also timely and necessary for those lands and their peoples. A renewed Pentecost opens wide the doors of the Church, in order that no culture remain closed in on itself and no people cut off from the universal communion of the faith. No one ought to remain closed in self-absorption, in the self-referentiality of his or her own ethnic and religious affiliation. The Easter event of Jesus breaks through the narrow limits of worlds, religions and cultures, calling them to grow in respect for the dignity of men and women, and towards a deeper conversion to the truth of the Risen Lord who gives authentic life to all.

Here I am reminded of the words of Pope Benedict XVI at the beginning of the meeting of Latin American Bishops at Aparecida, Brazil, in 2007. I would like to repeat these words and make them my own: “Yet what did the acceptance of the Christian faith mean for the nations of Latin America and the Caribbean? For them, it meant knowing and welcoming Christ, the unknown God whom their ancestors were seeking, without realizing it, in their rich religious traditions. Christ is the Saviour for whom they were silently longing. It also meant that they received, in the waters of Baptism, the divine life that made them children of God by adoption; moreover, they received the Holy Spirit who came to make their cultures fruitful, purifying them and developing the numerous seeds that the incarnate Word had planted in them, thereby guiding them along the paths of the Gospel... The Word of God, in becoming flesh in Jesus Christ, also became history and culture. The utopia of going back to breathe life into the pre-Columbian religions, separating them from Christ and from the universal Church, would not be a step forward: indeed, it would be a step back. In reality, it would be a retreat towards a stage in history anchored in the past” (*Address at the Inaugural Session*, 13 May 2007: *Insegnamenti* III, 1 [2007], 855-856).

We entrust the Church’s mission to Mary our Mother. In union with her Son, from the moment of the Incarnation the Blessed Virgin set out on her pilgrim way. She was fully involved in the mission of Jesus, a mission that became her own at the foot of the Cross: the mission of cooperating, as Mother of the Church, in bringing new sons and daughters of God to birth in the Spirit and in faith.

I would like to conclude with a brief word about the Pontifical Mission Societies, already proposed in *Maximum Illud* as a missionary resource. The Pontifical Mission Societies serve the Church’s universality as a global network of support for the Pope in his missionary commitment by prayer, the soul of mission, and charitable offerings from Christians throughout the world. Their donations assist the Pope in the evangelization efforts of particular Churches (the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith), in the formation of local clergy (the Pontifical Society of Saint

Peter the Apostle), in raising missionary awareness in children (Pontifical Society of Missionary Childhood) and in encouraging the missionary dimension of Christian faith (Pontifical Missionary Union). In renewing my support for these Societies, I trust that the extraordinary Missionary Month of October 2019 will contribute to the renewal of their missionary service to my ministry.

To men and women missionaries, and to all those who, by virtue of their baptism, share in any way in the mission of the Church, I send my heartfelt blessing.

2. **Reminder III:** November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints. No other Masses are permitted on that day. There is no Vigil Mass for All Souls on 1st November, since All Saints is a solemnity that ends with Night prayers for solemnity. Hence, kindly follow the liturgical norms of the Church. Please educate the faithful and do not mislead them making All Souls day a solemnity.

3. **Liturgy of the Word of God:** As per the liturgical norms, the liturgy of the Word has to be conducted from the Lectern (Readings, the Responsorial Psalm, the Gospel, the homily and **the Prayers of the Faithful**). Prayers of the Faithful also may be read from the assembly. Kindly do not use the Altar for the proclamation of the Gospel and homily. The homily also may be given from presidential chair.

4. **Table of the Eucharist (Altar):** During the Mass the Altar is used to celebrate the Eucharist alone. Hence, it is to be used from the time of preparation of the Altar (after the Liturgy of the Word) until the Holy Communion or the Prayer after Communion (GIRM 165). *Conducting Holy Hour and Novena from the Altar may be seen as an abuse of the Altar.*
